#### From our Worshipful Master, Bruce Taylor

Greetings from the East Brethren,

Our First Stated for October, in which we will take an important vote regarding the expenditure of funds on a new HVAC system for the remainder of the building. The long and short:

- 1. Aside from the HVAC system we have added to the lodge room, the rest of the building still runs on the old oil boilers, including hot water.
- 2. The chimney in said system is big, old, unlined, and in need of serious repair, totaling somewhere in the neighborhood of \$18k.
- 3. Repairing the old system, plus the cost of oil for a year will cost us approx. \$24k.
- 4. CMTA proposes replacing the boilers with a modern, gas operated, Heat-Pump system which will heat and cool the remainder of the building, as well as give us domestic hot water, for a total of \$35k with professional installation.
- 5. CMTA hopes to obtain a quote on any re-sale value that may be gained from the sale of the existing oil units, which are not very old and in good condition.

We will follow up that fun conversation with an educational lecture regarding Geometry for the benefit of our new Fellowcraft Brothers.

#### The Forget-Me-Not in Masonry

This article is drawn from several unpublished statements by Masons on the significance of the Forget-Me-Not flower in Masonry.

When Adolf Hitler rose to power, there were about 85,000 Masons in Germany. He had long viewed Freemasonry as part of what he termed "the Jewish Conspiracy" and, as such,

he saw Freemasonry as a threat to his bid for world domination. Hitler, an atheist, was right in that regard; Masonic principles are diametrically opposed to what he stood for. A primary requirement for membership in our fraternity is a declaration of belief in God.

Membership in our fraternity was declared a crime against the state, and you know how such a "crime" was dealt with. Hitler assigned Adolph Eichmann to conduct the purge. Eichmann raided the Grand Lodge of Germany and took all the records, which included the names and addresses of 80,000 German Masons.

He issued secret orders for their death; they were rounded up and sent to concentration camps or, sometimes, just murdered on the street. The 5,000 Masons whose names had, for unknown reasons, not been entered on the books of the Grand Lodge were spared only because Eichmann didn't know who they were. They immediately went underground. They hid all their Masonic records and insignia. To recognize each other they adopted a little flower which they wore in their lapels.

That little flower is the Forget-Me-Not. Its botanical name is *Myosotis sylvatica* and it belongs to the Borage family. It grows in both wild and cultivated forms in temperate regions. It has a hairy stem, light green leaves and flowers which are usually sky



blue with yellow centers. It is a symbol of friendship and true love which appears in many legends. In

German legend, "Forget me not" were the last words a man spoke to his sweetheart before he drowned while trying to get the pretty flower for her from the banks of a river.

The Nazis never found out the Masonic meaning of the little blue flower. The flowers could be seen on the streets and even in concentration camps—seen but not perceived as a Masonic emblem, except by those to whom meaning and representation so rightfully belonged.

After peace was restored, Masonic lodges were again established. In 1947, when the German Grand Lodge was reopened in Bayreuth, a little blue pin in the shape of a Forget-Me-Not was proposed and adopted as the official emblem of the first annual convention of those who had survived the bitter years of semi-darkness, bringing the light of Masonry once again into the lodges. In 1948 the pin was adopted by the United Grand Lodge of Germany as an official Masonic emblem honoring those valiant brethren who carried on their work under the most adverse conditions imaginable.

Today, if you see such a pin in a man's lapel, you'll know he is most likely a Freemason. However, the Forget-Me-Not has also been adopted by the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) and on Veterans Day cloth replicas of it are given away to people. (It is hoped that the recipients make a contribution to the collection cup



held by the disabled vet because all donations are used to support DAV activities to benefit their membership.)

Disabled vets also want to be remembered—and should be.

Hopefully speaking, this latest symbol of Masonry to find its way to American shores from Europe will be the last of the variety which is nurtured in the blood, sweat and tears of brethren light-bearers. ■
