#### Temple Lodge #16 Mosaic Pavement Project

During the February 20, 2025 business meeting, the Officers made an initial introduction of a project we would like the Lodge to consider for this year. We are hoping to upgrade the Lodge with the installation of Mosaic Pavement.

Mosaic Pavement is commonplace in many Lodges. As explained in Mackey's Encyclopedia of Freemasonry:

The mosaic pavement is an old symbol of the Order. It is met with in the earliest rituals of the last century. It is classed among the ornaments of the Lodge in combination with the indented tessel and the blazing star. Its party-colored stones of black and white have been readily and appropriately interpreted as symbols of the evil and good of human life.

The meaning of the Mosaic Pavement is similar to the meaning of the familiar yin and yang of Chinese philosophy. Both illustrate how opposing forces (i.e., good and evil) when in balance are interconnected and complementary.



Mosaic Pavement, however, shows this balance with its checkered pattern of black and white squares bordered by the indented tessel.



This balance, which we are ever admonished to practice in our lives and in our dealings, highlights the importance of standing uprightly in our several stations before God and man. The Mosaic Pavement, being the physical manifestation of this balance within Lodges, is also a representation of the ground floor of King Solomon's Temple. See Albert G. Mackey, *An Encyclopaedia of Freemasons and Its Kindred Sciences, Volume II* (New York and London: The Masonic History Company, 1916), p. 279 (The term Floor is defined as follows: "The floor of a properly constructed Lodge room should be covered with alternate squares of black and white, to represent the Mosaic pavement which was the ground floor of King Solomon's Temple.").

Please know that the Officers are presently researching options to purchase and install Mosaic Pavement with the fervent hope that the Brothers will support this proposed addition to our Lodge. We believe that it would be a fitting upgrade to Temple Lodge #16. Or, as more suitably expressed by our Senior Deacon, "[h]ow great it will be to put on the EA degree [in the Fall] and then perform the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> lectures with the mosaic floor installed. Epic!". Epic indeed, and a fitting improvement to our wonderful Lodge.

Please also know, as was announced at the February 20, 2025 business meeting, that it is our intention is to request donations for the cost of the Mosaic Pavement such that no general funds will be utilized for either the purchase of material or for the installation of the floor. In this regard, it was announced that should Brothers not wish to make this improvement, as expressed by the absence of donations, the floor will not be installed. The reason for this is quite simple: we have for several years been making improvements to the building to ensure its longevity and, in addition to the costs of regular maintenance, fiscal responsibility dictates that we prioritize the use of general funds to what is necessary before making a beneficial improvement that is not required. Stated another way, Mosaic Pavement would undoubtedly be a wonderful addition to the Lodge, but it is an addition that the Brothers should authorize through their beneficence and their wish to see such an improvement. To conclude, I leave you with a wonderful reference from WB Shawn Eyer's article on Mosaic pavement and the importance of the black and white tiled floor, the indented tessel and the blazing star:

How can we not be struck by this powerful visual reminder of a Divine Presence dwelling among us? And how can we not be impressed by the infinite scale which our tradition assigns to this geometrical figure? For it has long been taught that:

A Lodge is said, symbolically, to extend in length from east to west; in breadth, from north to south; in height, from the earth to the highest heavens; in depth, from the surface to the center.<sup>16</sup>

When we remember the Blazing Star in the center of the Lodge, this Masonic teaching strongly resembles the ancient Hermetic maxim adopted by so many philosophers, that "God is an intelligible sphere, whose center point is everywhere, and whose circumference nowhere."<sup>17</sup> We may stand in awe in contemplation of the Infinite, but more awesome still is the fact that aspects of Infinity are indeed intelligible and may be represented by symbols and referenced by our ritual.


#### **TEMPLE LODGE #16**
