From our Worshipful Master, Eric Desmond

My Dear Brothers:

Greetings from the East!

I was recently reading some works by John Muir, the famous naturalist and conservationist who greatly influenced President Theodore Roosevelt's decision to protect and preserve a vast amount of land for the benefit of future generations. In fact, it was John Muir, being concerned about the destruction of land in the western United States, who invited President Roosevelt to camp with him in Yosemite Valley. Of the May 1903 aweinducing experience, President Roosevelt expressed wonderment about camping under Grizzly Giant and also near Glacier Point. President Roosevelt remarked that camping near Grizzly Giant, in the Mariposa Grove,



was akin to visiting "a temple greater than any human architect could by any possibility build." And as to Glacier Point, President Roosevelt joyously recounted that "[w]e were in a snowstorm last night and it was just what I wanted." See Roosevelt, Muir, and the Grace of Place - Yosemite National Park (U.S. National Park Service). Of the entire experience, President Roosevelt remarked – about what was to become an expanded Yosemite National Park – that "[i]t was like lying in a great solemn cathedral, far vaster and more beautiful than any built by the hand of man."

Not long after, in 1906, Yosemite Valley and the Mariposa Grove were re-ceded to the United States for inclusion in Yosemite National Park (est. 1890). Interestingly, Abraham Lincoln signed during the Civil War an Act of Congress (on June 30, 1864) ceding Mariposa Grove and Yosemite Valley to the State of California for "public use, resort, and recreation" – which is the first instance of the Federal government setting aside natural areas for the protection and benefit of future generations. In all, President Roosevelt established 150 national forests (along with the United States Forest Service), 51 federal bird reserves, 4 national game preserves, 5 national parks, and 18 national monuments. See Theodore Roosevelt and Conservation - Theodore Roosevelt National Park (U.S. National Park Service).

While serving as President of the United States, Brother Roosevelt on November 5, 1902 delivered an address to the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. During that address, Brother Roosevelt expressed his admiration for Masonry in a manner with which I find myself in complete agreement, and which I likewise find reflected by the Brothers of Temple Lodge # 16. Brother Roosevelt explained his veneration for Masonry as follows:

"One of the things that attracted me so greatly to Masonry, that I hailed the chance of becoming a Mason, was that it really did act up to what we, as a government and as a people, are pledged to, — of treating each man on his merits as a man. When Brother George Washington went into

a Lodge of the Fraternity he went into the one place in the United States where he stood below or above his fellows according to their official position in the Lodge. He went into the place where the idea of our government was realized as far as it is humanly possible for mankind to realize a lofty ideal. And I know that you will not only understand me, but sympathize with me, when I say that, great though my pleasure is in being here as your guest in this beautiful Temple, and in meeting such a body of men as this is that I am now addressing, I think my pleasure is even greater when going into some little Lodge, where I meet the plain, hard-working men, — the men who work with their hands, — and meet them on a footing of genuine equality, not false equality, of genuine equality conditioned upon each man being a decent man, a fair-dealing man."

One of the endearing qualities of Temple Lodge # 16 is the inherent goodwill, camaraderie and respect among its Members - as well as the care expressed by its Members for future generations of Masons. Temple Lodge #16 is special because Brotherhood finds itself expressed in varving ways. It is not uncommon to find that an individual Brother has reached out directly to aid and assist another Brother in need. On a weekly basis, there are groups of Brothers working to host events, to improve the Lodge building for the use and enjoyment of other Brothers or to upkeep and effectuate repairs. And then there are the unsung Brothers who act with foresight to plan for Brothers yet to be met, or who they may never know, but for whom they work to protect and preserve Temple Lodge #16. Brother Roosevelt, when speaking about conservation and preservation of the natural world, admonished that "[o]f all the questions which can come before this nation, short of the actual preservation of its existence in a great war, there is none which compares in importance with the great central task of leaving this land even a better land for our descendants than it is for us." I believe the same principle guides the Brothers of Temple Lodge #16 – always meeting on a footing of genuine equality to work and toil without precondition, recompense or recognition for the purpose of leaving the Lodge in a better position for Brothers yet to come.

While there are a number of examples of hard work by our Brothers – including the recent installation of the three lesser lights at the altar by Worshipful Brother Steve Blake and Worshipful Brother Bruce Taylor – it is my pleasure to confirm that our fundraising drive for the installation of Mosaic Pavement is moving along. We have received nearly \$2,900
